Lesson Title: Societal Tradeoffs and Privacy

Grade Level: 9-12

Learning Objectives/Outcomes: Students will be able to assess personal and societal trade-offs related to computing technologies and privacy. (9-12.IC.4)

How will you facilitate learning? Facilitating classroom discussion, modeling investigation of tradeoffs, prompts for reflection questions, provide reference articles in LMS

Summary: Students identify tradeoffs between societal benefits and privacy tradeoffs for multiple use cases

Learning Types: Small group project with whole class presentation

Materials List: Internet connection, computing device, presentation software, web camera and microphone

Accommodations: Word bank, extra time to complete, simplified verbal instructions, multiple submission formats (video, presentation, written paper) allowed

Description of Activity:

- Brainstorm different use cases that involve technology
- Teacher-led example investigation of tradeoffs
- Small group investigation
- Class presentations

- Wrap-up and summary
- Write in learning journal for reflection
